

Several landscapers were consulted and NJ Central Nursery here are the recommendations:

Pear Trees – Bradford Pears are not recommended they break in the wind.

The following Pears are recommended:

Aristocrate
Capital
Chanticleer

These trees can be used for Street trees as they will hold up to wind

Ash – Green (not Ash White)
Honey Locust (thorn less)
Mountain Ash (American) – Likes well drained acid soil
Red Bud – Eastern – Pretty Pink flowers turns green in summer. Should be planted closer to house – gets 20-30 feet tall (for small plots)

All these trees are disease resistant; tolerate poor soil and lack of water.

It was recommended that we mix them up a bit so as not to have same species.

ANY DIGGING REQUIRES THE UTILITY COMPANY TO MARK OUT!!

Trees have to be planted five (5) feet from utility boxes.

Any new plantings need to be waters for at least ninety (90) days.
